**RECOVERY SUPPORTS  
STATE FISCAL YEAR 2017**

Beginning in SFY 2014, Mental Health & Recovery Board of Clark, Greene and Madison Counties (MHRB) began meeting with stakeholders in the three (3) counties to determine gaps in recovery supports. The conclusion reached in all the counties was the need for safe, sober space for socializing; support meetings; and obtaining information on resources. Each county has successfully launched a community recovery center to meet these needs.

Currently local agencies are serving as fiscal agents for the community recovery centers. Each center is in the process of becoming or has become a tax-exempt not-for-profit organization.

**CRIMINAL JUSTICE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH LINKAGES  
MHRB and McKINLEY HALL  
STATE FISCAL YEAR 2017**

In September 2015 the Mental Health & Recovery Board of Clark, Greene and Madison Counties (MHRB) applied for a “Criminal Justice Behavioral Health Linkages Project” grant from the Ohio Department of Mental Health & Addiction Services (OMHAS) to receive funds to create and enhance transitioning opportunities for incarcerated residents of Clark County, targeting individuals who are incarcerated at the Clark County Jail and West Central Community Correctional Facility (WCCF).

Specifically this funding will allow diagnostic assessment and case management services for individuals incarcerated at the Clark County Jail and WCCF prior to release in order to increase engagement in services and access to resources post release. The funding provides for a therapist, case manager, psychotropic medication (pre and post release) and transportation. Services will be provided through McKinley Hall.

A variety of outcomes will be collected such as the number of individuals served and staff trained, clients engaging in the treatment services upon release, acquiring stable housing, obtaining employment, and rate of recidivism.

**IT IS THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE THAT THE MENTAL HEALTH & RECOVERY BOARD OF CLARK, GREENE AND MADISON COUNTIES AUTHORIZE THE CEO TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH McKINLEY HALL FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$129,300 FOR PROVIDING SERVICES TO INCARCERATED CLARK COUNTY INDIVIDUALS AT THE CLARK COUNTY JAIL AND WEST CENTRAL COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS FACILITY. PAYMENT IS ON A COST REIMBURSEMENT BASIS.**

**GAMBLING ALLOCATION  
SFY 2017**

Since 2009 local Boards have received allocations from the Ohio Department of Mental Health & Addiction Services (OMHAS) from “a state problem gambling and addiction fund to be used for the treatment of problem gambling and substance abuse and related research.” (§ 15.06(2)(g))

For SFY 2017, it is proposed that funding be spent to develop capacity to prevent and treat problem gambling and to increase access to prevention and treatment services across our Board area.

- 1) Prevention: The \$67,711 prevention allocation will be used to increase access to problem gambling related prevention services and to integrate problem gambling prevention with other prevention initiatives across the three counties through training, workforce development and campaign development and implementation. Examples of opportunities for integration include: Gatekeeper Cards in Clark County; the Madison Man Depression and Suicide Prevention Campaign in Madison County; and Risky Business in Greene County.
- 2) Treatment: The \$45,141 will be used to increase access to problem gambling related screening, assessment and treatment services and to develop and support local expertise in treating problem gambling.

**IT IS THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE THAT THE MENTAL HEALTH & RECOVERY BOARD OF CLARK, GREENE AND MADISON COUNTIES AUTHORIZE THE CEO TO SPEND AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$112,852 FOR THE FOLLOWING SERVICES.**

**EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN HOUSING AGENCIES  
MHRB and HOUSING SOLUTIONS  
STATE FISCAL YEAR 2017**

In September 2015 the Mental Health & Recovery Board of Clark, Greene and Madison Counties (MHRB) applied for an “Employment Opportunities within Housing Agencies/Departments” grant from the Ohio Department of Mental Health & Addiction Services (OMHAS) to receive funds for the employment of individuals with a lived experience of mental illness and/or substance use disorders residing in permanent housing, specifically to be used at Housing Solutions.

The grant provides funding for a full-time maintenance position to allow work orders for the agency’s 55 units of Permanent Supportive Housing to be addressed in a timelier manner. Also funded is a part-time (20 hours/week) housing specialist who will work directly with residents, landlords and Greene Metropolitan Housing Authority to secure Section 8, Public Housing and Shelter Plus Care subsidies.

A variety of outcomes will be collected such as the number of tenants that fulfill their lease agreement, number of tenants that participate in the extermination and prevention of pests, and the timeliness of resolution of reported repairs and maintenance issues reported.

**IT IS THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE THAT THE MENTAL HEALTH & RECOVERY BOARD OF CLARK, GREENE AND MADISON COUNTIES AUTHORIZE THE CEO TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH HOUSING SOLUTIONS FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$42,832 FOR EMPLOYING ADDITIONAL STAFF TO MEET AGENCY NEEDS. PAYMENT IS ON A COST REIMBURSEMENT BASIS.**
